

DR. BRUGUIERE DISMISSES HIS SUIT FOR A DIVORCE

The noted Bruguiere divorce case was dismissed in the district court this morning. The motion to take the case out of court was made by W. B. Craig, attorney for Dr. Peder S. Brugulere, who brought the proceeding, and afterward neither Mr. Craig or his client would make a statement, explaining their action. It is understood, however, that the dismissal was secured on account of an error made in the prosecution of the case, and that later, after the doctor has secured a firmer residence, that it will be filed again.

"I have no statement to make," said Mr. Craig this afternoon. "We have dismissed the case for reasons best known to ourselves and under no circumstances will either myself or Dr. Brugulere make a statement of the way matters stand."

Dr. Brugulere lived up to his part of the little drama by repeating the statements of his attorney. "I can't make a statement," he said. "Some other time I can tell you all about it."

When asked if there has been a reconciliation between himself and his wife Dr. Brugulere smiled and remarked, "Well if that were true I should be a happy man."

Questioned about the suit brought

by Mrs. Brugulere in the superior court in San Francisco for alimony Attorney Craig said that inasmuch as her complaint attacked the suit filed in Reno by Dr. Brugulere she might have to withdraw her complaint."

An attorney who seems to be well informed about the case stated to the Gazette that in his opinion the plaintiff had erred in securing service upon the plaintiff, that insufficient time had elapsed when a default was taken. He said that if a divorce had been secured that it could have been set aside on this account. This attorney also stated that in his opinion Dr. Brugulere hesitated about going into court without having demonstrated beyond all doubt that he is a bona fide resident of Reno.
