

WEDNESDAY, NOV. 28, 1934

Was a bit sleepy today but the events kept me wide awake. At 9:30 the Burns papers were filed and the case was set in Dept I at 1:30. All went well and by 2:15 Bobby Burns was a free man. This evening Bobby and Margaret took me to the Tavern for a grand Thanksgiving dinner and it proved to be a very enjoyable evening for me. They told me that they are going to marry just as soon as she can obtain her divorce decree, which will probably be Dec 17 or 18. I told them I will give them 40 acres of land at Triune Ranch for a wedding present and if they will agree to use it for a summer home and not sell or lease it etc I'll let them pick it out. I described the Head of Spring Creek to them and they are all enthusiastic. The present plan is for them to fly to Wendover next June - I will meet them there and take them down to the ranch - I would love to have such people for neighbors and such a thing could result in great advantages for all of us.

When Burns first consulted me about divorce, I quoted him a fee of \$250 including costs. Now it should have been more, but I saw fit to abide by my original quotation.
