

ADAMS' ANSWER

MUST BE MADE

In a decision filed today by District Judge Moran in the case of Jennie Adams against Robert J. Adams the latter is directed to answer certain questions propounded to him by Mrs. Adams' attorneys before a notary pursuant to a notice to take his deposition. Adams refused to answer the questions on the advice of his counsel when his affidavit was taken before a notary and the matter was argued before the court last week.

The court directs Adams to answer the question as to whether or not he supported his wife after he went to France also as to whether or not he has had detectives watching his wife since she came to Reno.

As to whether or not he has received reports of detectives employed to watch his wife the court rules that Adams need not answer. Neither is he required to tell whether or not he has copies of letters he wrote to her and will not be required to produce, at the hearing before the notary, the letters written to him by his wife while he was in France.
